Felt:

Natural Felt (Wool Felt): Wool felt is a natural and durable material, valued for its warmth, softness, and resilience. With proper care, your felt products will maintain their shape and appearance for years. Wool comes from sheep and other animals, making it a 100% natural and renewable resource. Naturally Fire-Resistant: Wool does not ignite easily and tends to self-extinguish, making it safer around heat. Biodegradable: Wool naturally decomposes in soil within a few years, releasing valuable nutrients back into the earth.

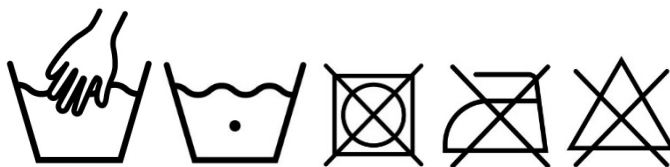
How to clean Felt:

Washing felt shouldn't be a frequent affair. Wool Felt is naturally resistant to dirt and moisture, meaning it often doesn't need to be washed as frequently as other fabrics. However, there are times when washing is necessary:

- **Dry Cleaning First**
Use a lint roller or masking tape to gently remove dust, lint, and pet hair regularly. This keeps felt clean without moisture.
- **Use a Soft Brush**
Lightly brush felt with a soft-bristled brush (like a baby hairbrush or clean toothbrush) to remove surface dirt without damaging fibers.
- **Spot Clean Gently**
For small stains, use a mild soap (baby shampoo or wool wash) diluted in cool water. Blot stains gently with a cotton swab or cloth—avoid rubbing to prevent pilling.
- **Avoid Hot Water**
Always use cool or lukewarm water for any cleaning. Hot water can shrink or distort felt fibers.
- **Hand Wash Only When Necessary**
If heavily soiled, hand wash felt briefly and gently in cool water with mild soap. Never twist, wring, or scrub.
- **Rinse Thoroughly**
Ensure all soap is rinsed out with cool water to prevent residue buildup, which can stiffen or discolor felt.
- **Dry Flat and Avoid Heat**
Press excess water out between towels, reshape gently, and lay flat to air dry. Avoid tumble dryers, ironing directly on felt, or direct heat.
- **Store Properly**
Keep felt items in dry, dust-free containers such as zip bags or plastic bins. Avoid crushing or folding felt unnecessarily to maintain shape.
- **Avoid Direct Sunlight**
Prolonged exposure to sunlight can fade colors and weaken fibers. Store felt items away from direct light.
- **Use Silica Gel for Moisture Control**
For long-term storage, include silica gel packets to absorb moisture and prevent mold or mildew damage.

WASHING RECOMMENDATIONS

- Hand wash in cold water, avoid hot water to prevent shrinking

Please Note:

Regular dry cleaning combined with very gentle wet cleaning only when needed will keep handmade felt pieces looking their best. Proper drying, storage, and protection from heat and sunlight preserve their texture, shape, and color over time. If pilling occurs, carefully trim loose fibers with scissors.
